	It was agreed and <b>RESOLVED</b> that the payments for December 2019, as presented, are approved. Please refer to <b>Appendix A.</b>

	A sub-committee report was circulated. Please refer to <b>Appendix B</b> . There was one recommendation.					
	It was agreed and <b>RESOLVED</b> that the application pack and advert for the position of Horticultural Grounds Person is approved for circulation.					
115.	To receive and approve the 3 <sup>rd</sup> quarter management accounts to 31 <sup>st</sup> December 2019.					
	The management accounts were circulated prior to the meeting. Please refer to <b>Appendix C.</b> Members thanked the RFO.					
	It was agreed and <b>RESOLVED</b> that the 3 <sup>rd</sup> quarter accounts to 31 <sup>st</sup> December 2019 are approved.					
116.	To receive any requests for virement of budgets.					
	The RFO referred to page 1a of the management accounts and explained the reasons for the virements.  It was agreed and <b>RESOLVED</b> that the virements shown on page 1a of the					
	management accounts are approved.					
117.	To review the current Grants Policy and make recommendations to Full Council.					
	It was agreed and <b>RESOLVED</b> that the Agenda Item No. 9 is deferred until the February meeting of the Finance Committee.					
118.	To receive notification from Dorset Council of the taxbase for FY 2020/21 and to consider the impact on the precept.					
	The Chairman reminded members that on 9 <sup>th</sup> December 2019 the town council had agreed and resolved that the total figure of £940,037 in the draft budget for FY 2020/21 was approved in principle (Minute No. 105).					
	NB. Please note that £940,037 is the draft budget figure and <b>not</b> the draft precept figure.					
	The Chairman informed members that Dorset Council has now informed the Town Council of the taxbase figure for Gillingham and explained that this figure is used to calculate the council tax charge on a property in Band D by dividing the precept figure by the taxbase. The charges for other bands are set proportions of this Band D charge.					
	The Chairman explained that the total draft precept figure of £909,118 (as agreed in principle on 9 <sup>th</sup> December 2019) equates to an increase of 5.88% on the previous year's budget. For a Band D property, this equates to 6.04% i.e. an extra £12.36 a year.					
	The Chairman reiterated that the Town Council has worked hard to obtain value for money for council tax payers, whilst at the same time providing the projects, functions and services that the community needs and values; however she was aware of some					

concerns over the proposed increase in the draft budget and asked members to consider the following options in order to reduce the budget further:

Budget No. 5001 - Removal of Cemetery Spoil Heap - Budget reduced by £750

Budget No. 6202 – Mayor's Expenses (tickets etc) – Budget reduced by £500

Budget No. 6201 – Mayor's Travelling Expenses – Budget reduced by £500

Budget No. 7068 – Town Hall Furniture / Office Equipment – Budget reduced by £1,600

The Chairman explained that by reducing the budget by £3,350 the precept figure would be reduced to £905,768 which is a 5.49% increase. For a Band D property, this equates to 5.65% i.e. an extra £11.56 a year.

Cllr Pothecary stated that she felt uncomfortable with the increase and asked how much the budget would need to be reduced by in order to bring the increase down to 3.5%.

The RFO informed members that in order to achieve a 3.5% increase, the budget would need to be reduced by £21,784. Cllr von Clemens agreed with Cllr Pothecary and asked members to consider ways in which the budget could be reduced. Various options were discussed.

Following the discussion, it was agreed and **RESOLVED** that a recommendation is made to Full Council that the budget for FY 2020/21 is reduced by £9,850 by making the following amendments:

	Recommended Total Reduction:	£9,850

Reducing the budget by £9,850 will reduce the precept figure to £899,268 which is a 4.74% increase in the precept. For a Band D property, this equates to 4.89% i.e. an extra £10.01 a year.

Cllr Pothecary abstained from voting.

The Chairman informed members that a letter has been received from North Dorset Rugby Football Club thanking the council for the grant of £1,000 and confirming that the funds have been used towards the provision and laying of a concrete floor in the new storage building currently being erected.
