PREPARING FOR WINTER

Is it ok to clear snow from a road, path or cycleway?

Guidelines from the government say it is ok to do so, you can clear snow and ice from pavements yourself.

How to clear snow and ice.

- do it early in the day it's easier to move fresh, loose snow
- don't use water it might refreeze and turn to black ice
- use salt if possible it will melt the ice or snow and stop it from refreezing overnight (but don't use the salt from salting bins as this is used to keep roads clear)
- you can use ash and sand if you don't have enough salt it will provide grip underfoot
- pay extra attention when clearing steps and steep pathways – using more salt may help

Grit bins are available around Gillingham for community use on roads and pavements only (not private drives). For further information and bin locations please visit our website.
