- the site is situated adjacent to a listed building (List Entry Number: 1172630) and the proposal will improve and enhance the area.

Footpath 73 Diversion Task and Finish Group

I am pleased to report that progress has been made. Graham Stanley, Dorset Council Rights of Way Officer, has been in discussion with one of the landowners, whose consent is vital, and has clarified a few queries as a result of which there is a minor change to the proposed route of the footpath. Letters have been sent to the other relevant landowners seeking their consent to the proposed change. It is hoped that their approval will be forthcoming in the very near future which means the application can then be submitted to Dorset Council.

Graham Stanley has confirmed that notwithstanding the proposed change the project will still be within the budget.

Footpath to NDRFC Task and Finish Group

The first meeting of this task and finish group took place on the 2nd March 2021.

It was agreed that Cllr Graham Poulter would be lead member.

A discussion was had as to how the group should proceed and it was agreed that contact would first be made with Dorset Council to ascertain what, if any, funding was available as this would dictate what, if anything, could be achieved. We are waiting to hear. Should positive news be received a meeting will be arranged with NDRFC for initial discussions.

The initial impression of the group, from their personal knowledge of the state of the existing footpaths and given the length of the new footpath which would be required, is that it is highly unlikely that a cycle path could be achieved but to some extent this would depend on what funding was available.

It is, of course, very early days and hopefully there will be more substantive news in the next report.
